How can student futures help you?

Student futures, the Careers, Employability and Enterprise service offers a range of support to all undergraduate and postgraduate students at the university and continues to offer this after graduation for life.

This support includes:

- Advice on the application process (including feedback on CVs, support with application forms and preparation for interviews)
- Careers guidance meetings (to provide you with an opportunity to discuss your career ideas, consider how to find out information about employment and to identify your next steps)
- Information on when, if and how to talk about your disabilities, health condition or who are neurodiverse to employers
- Events and Workshops specifically for individuals who are disabled have a health condition or are neurodiverse (virtual or in-person sessions, with opportunities to take part in activities, discuss issues and ask questions)
- Mock interviews (the opportunity to practice answering interview questions and to receive feedback on these)
