- Advise and assist, where appropriate, on the recruitment of students for programmes.
- Encourage and assist, where appropriate, the interchange of staff between the School and industry.

- Identify opportunities for consultancy and Continuing Professional Development (CPD) training by the School, and encourage their use by industry.
- Help in establishing where desirable, special prizes and other awards with the object of encouraging capable and deserving students.
- Promote collaboration and research between the School and industry.
