LIFE-LIVING: How the collaborative arts event performs possibilities for a more visible and connected recovery community.

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LIFE-LIVING

OLife-living...refuses to privilege *this* life, this human life, at the expense of different forms of life, even as it recognises the importance of the punctuality of *this* singular event we call our life...asking at every juncture what else life could be... (Manning, *The Minor Gesture* 2016: 8).

ASSEMBLAGES OF ADDICTION

Cach event of consumption combines spaces, bodies, affects and relations in the expression of drug effects – pleasure, humour, anxiety, camaraderie, hostility, euphoria, fear, violence, intimacy, alienation – in the experience of intoxication expressed by an order of degrees. In turn, each such event assembles fragments of subjectivity that are distributed in and among the bodies human and nonhuman that amass in that event (Cameron Duff, Assemblages of Health 2014:127)

The potential of performance events

OPerformance events hold the potential to instigate occasions of recovery communities that appreciate 'liveliving' as a process of connection and collaboration.
