## Issues to consider during the assessments

- 1. Current circumstances, particularly including asylum process related/ legal and social problems that may be having a major impact on mental health.
- 2. Background information on person's country of origin, culture and ethnicity.
- 3. **Family history**, including childhood experiences.
- 4. **History of traumatic events and persecution** in country of origin (including arrests torture, sexual violence, war)
- 5. **Booking interpreters** if required or providing information in the appropriate format as determined by the individual, ensuring gender specific interpreters are available if requested.
- 6. **Social and political experiences** relevant to the person's asylum claim.
- 7. **Journey to exile** (when and how did they leave their country and how did they get here)
- 8. Family separation and losses
- 9. **Physical complaints** and injuries(including head injury sustained during torture or abuse)
- 10. PTSD symptoms & Mental health status prior to traumatic events
- 11. Experiences of isolation, hardship, racism
- 12. Caring responsibilities, e.g. welfare of children in the family
