## An introduction to self-help Library and study skills resources (22<sup>nd</sup> February 2021)

**Questions & Answers** 

Q. Do students need to be logged in with their LJMU credentials to access the skills resources and tutorials?

A. Students do not need to be logged into their LJMU IT account to access the Library tutorials and skills resources.

Students do not need to be logged in to search for items using the Library catalogue (Discover). However, it is beneficial for students to log in first before searching for items, as the results will bring up accessible items. Students can check they are logged into Discover by looking at the top right-hand section of the page, where they should see their name.

## Q. Are there are any resources available for students about time management skills?

A. The Library Services Team do not currently have pre-existing content on this subject area but would look to develop materials for students.

## Q. Are there are any referencing software applications that are compatible with Dragon speech recognition software?

A. The software designers of Dragon (Nuance) advise users to contact the individual software vendors to check for compatibility. The Library Services Team would advise users to test their preferred referencing tool with their screen reader to judge compatibility.
