

Importance



Popularity and participation rates in female soccer are increasing exponentially on a **global scale**, yet there is a paucity of knowledge regarding development of talented female players.






Due to developmental differences between males and females, applying conclusions drawn from male data may be erroneous, therefore genderspecific enquiry is merited.

Recent changes to female soccer in England (mixedgender soccer limit raised to 18; introduction of Women's Super League (WSL) academy programme) intensify the need for exploratory research.

The present research will highlight the current engagement levels and perceptions of youth players for the first time, which can provide English clubs with contemporary information to continually advance their talent development systems and procedures.
