



Student Code of Behaviour

Taking part in the Summer University (SU) is a great experience. Staff and students treat it as quite an informal experience, you can dress casually and everyone is on first name terms with one another. However students attending the SU are expected to take a mature approach when taking part in the activities and to respect the other students and the SU staff who are there to support them. Even though the atmosphere is relaxed, there are some rules in place for behaviour and to ensure that the rights of students and staff are respected.

Code of Behaviour

Wherever possible, we will try to make the time you spend at SU as close to the real thing as possible. We have a responsibility to your parents/carers for your safety and well-being. All university students and staff have to follow certain rules to make the University a safe and welcoming place and as a student of our SU, you will also have to follow these rules:

- Take no part in any bullying of any kind, it will not be tolerated.
- Follow any emergency procedures, such as a fire drill, as directed by SU staff.
- Do not leave the site of the SU unless agreed by a member of SU staff.
- Attend all timetabled activities, unless other arrangements have been made with a member of SU staff.
- Do not bring or drink any alcohol during the SU. Any alcohol which is found will be confiscated, disposed of and your parents/carers will be called.
- Do not bring or take any illegal substances. We will always call the police if we discover any or have a reasonable suspicion.
- Smoking is only permitted at designated smoking areas across the University, at times agreed by SU staff.
- Do not enter student flats which are allocated to the opposite gender.
- Once you have returned to your flats at the end of the evening activities, you are to stay there until the following morning, except for an emergency.

During your stay

There may be occasions during your stay that SU staff will need to advise you of some other rules depending on the circumstances e.g. having a meal, on a trip, on private premises. If so, you will be expected to follow them not just for your own health and safety but also that of others. Remember that during your time here, you are also representing Liverpool John Moores University and as such, we expect the highest standards of behaviour from you.

Misbehaviour

In the case of serious or repeated misbehaviour, you may not be allowed to continue with your stay at SU and arrangements will be made for you to go home. Please be aware that you will be required to pay for any wilful damage of property.
